School Improvements


We want to share all of the amazing improvements we have been working on since our voluntary closure

Since our voluntary closure at the start of February, we have been working on a range of areas for improvement, including staff training, creating new teaching and learning spaces, improving the curriculum offer and rewriting our school policies so that they are right for our setting and our cohort of children.

Whilst the inspection did highlight areas of concern, we have used this as a catalyst to make changes and really improve the school so that what we offer our children is the very best.

Our Teaching Spaces



New Policies and Procedures

We have also been working with an external Safeguarding partner, who has supported us to review all of our policies and safeguarding procedures.

Whilst all staff were trained in Safeguarding previously, we have now strengthened their knowledge and understanding of safeguarding processes and procedures.
